Tryptophan for Grow-Finish Pigs

With increased use of DDGS in swine diets, there has been a big opportunity for both higher lysine and tryptophan in grow-finish diets. This is mainly because corn protein is deficient in lysine and tryptophan compared to soy protein. Recent studies have also shown that the Trp:Lys requirement is higher than previously suggested. These results suggest that feed efficiency is maximized at about 18% Trp:Lys, and growth can be improved up to as high as 21% Trp:Lys. The value of feeding between 18 and 21% Trp:Lys may vary by system depending on Tryptophan costs. cost of space, value of gain and carcass value. Additionally, when feeding aggressive levels of feed grade amino acids, a Net Energy system should be used to ensure energy is valued correctly, as a Metabolizable Energy system will underestimate the energy value of the diet causing either a lower feed efficiency or high carcass fat.
